

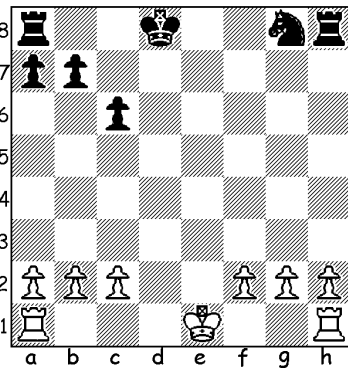

CASTLING

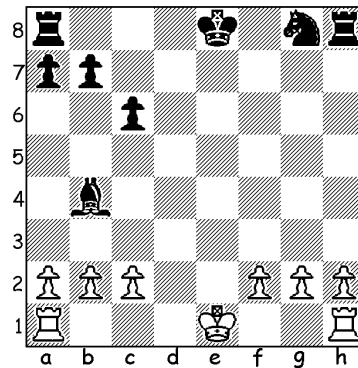
There is a special move in chess game allowing 2 pieces to be moved at a time: King and Rook. This move is made in order to help the protection of the King. To castle, you need to move your King two squares towards a Rook, and jump the Rook over the King placing it at the neighboring square. Castling can only be made when:

- There are no pieces in between the Rook and the King
- The King has not yet moved
- The Rook that is castling with the King has never moved
- The King is not in check
- The King will NOT cross squares that are attacked by opponent's pieces.

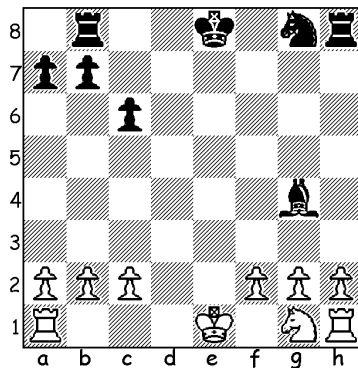

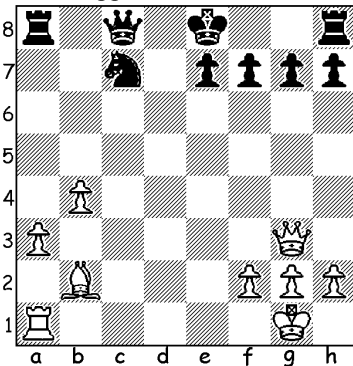
